Dear Beloved of Trinity,

Blessed and Merry Christmas to you. I am grateful to you for your shared ministry. We are the body of Christ and we are working toward the common goal of helping people connect to Jesus. It is a privilege to proclaim the good news together. I look forward to continued ministry with you in 2024.

Thank you to those who took a tag from the Giving Tree this year. The Giving Tree began after the ministry with Corn Creek Reservation came to an end in 2017. That wonderful ministry ended, and I knew it was important to provide another opportunity for service. The concept of the Giving Tree began in my previous congregation, so it was an easy transition to bring it to Tea and partner with the Tea Area Food Pantry for a client base. Together, we provided gifts to children in the area. This past year, we had more families than we've ever had. More families meant more children. I eliminated the cleaning supply tags so we could concentrate on gifts for children.

You are such a generous congregation. Gifts started to pour in. It takes a little time to sort gifts, making sure there is equality between siblings. This year there were many needs for shoes, boots, coats and socks. A non-member benefactor gave a generous gift of money so I could purchase these items. I was also able to use some coats from our coat drive. Richard Holland helped me find new donated coats. Skyla Thomas helped me label areas to begin the sorting process. Emily Seeman helped me sort and purchase gifts for a couple of families who registered late (that happens every year).

When it comes time for families to pick up their gifts, they are filled with gratitude. Most of the families we purchase gifts for are single moms and are the working poor.

Matthew 25 says *"Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? 38 And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? 39 And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?" 40 And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers,[a] you did it to me.'* "

May the grace of God shine upon you this Christmas, filling your heart with love, peace and the joyous spirit of the season. May his blessings be a source of comfort and inspiration, guiding you into a new year filled with hope and faith.
