So in worship, we hear Dawn, Joann or Gail play a music prelude as everyone enters the sanctuary. The music sets the mood for worship. At a concert, we hear a band or group prior to the headliner. Each of these preludes serves an important role yet is connected to what comes after it.

This week in scripture we read about John the Baptist who came before Jesus, proclaiming repentance and baptism. John is most definitely connected to what comes next. John is the prelude for Jesus.

John the Baptist was a gregarious, unorthodox preacher. He wore camel hair and ate locusts with honey. People may have regarded him as "unusual" yet there was something that drew people to him. That "something" was the good news that a Messiah was coming. John admitted he was not worthy of even tying his sandal.

For many in the first century, John was the one who introduced people to Jesus, the one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit.

Who is the person who told you about Jesus? Who was the "prelude" in your faith life? Jesus is the real deal. It is all about Him. John's humble role was to point to the real deal. He set the example for us. We are to point to the real deal, also, through our words, deeds and actions. Be proud to be a prelude. It is am important role.
