Dear friends in Christ.

Proverbs, Job, and Ecclesiastes in the Hebrew Scriptures are several books described as "wisdom" literature in the Bible. Of course, each book of scripture contains wisdom, but these books specifically reflect on the complex and various ways that personal character is formed in relationship with God's wisdom. For instance, Proverb 1:7 reminds us, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction." This certainly nails human experience. In hindsight most of us would recognize times when we were stubborn and foolish when we despised helpful instruction.

Sometimes, wisdom literature struggles with the times that the world doesn't seem fair when both the just and the unjust face personal struggles. This is most evident in the book of Job.

As winter finally has given way to spring, I have been remembering one of the most well know wisdom passages from Ecclesiastes that describes the way that God's engagement with individuals and the world resembles the change of seasons.

For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven:

- 2 a time to be born and a time to die;
- a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted;
- 3 a time to kill and a time to heal;
- a time to break down and a time to build up;
- 4 a time to weep and a time to laugh;
- a time to mourn and a time to dance;
- 5 a time to throw away stones and a time to gather stones together;
- a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing;
- 6 a time to seek and a time to lose;
- a time to keep and a time to throw away;
- 7 a time to tear and a time to sew;
- a time to keep silent and a time to speak;
- 8 a time to love and a time to hate;
- a time for war and a time for peace. -Ecclesiastes 3: 1-8

Indeed, human character is formed in the times of joy, sorrow, wonder, and change. The Biblical writers knew this, so do we. As congregations, families, and communities celebrate graduations this month, I praying for you as you enter your new season of life.
