...a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind Jesus and touched the fringe of his cloak. - Matthew 9:21

Dear friends in Christ,

Twelve years is a long time to be dealing with a hemorrhage in any historical era, but especially difficult in Jesus' day when the ritual purity laws basically made you untouchable. Twelve years. I imagine the woman eventually created routines in her life to survive, but she would have lived in near quarantine twenty-four hours a day for all those years. Then Jesus arrives.

In Matthew 9:21, we are given a glimpse into her thoughts when "she said to herself, 'If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." And she is made well, well in body, well in soul, and well in her regained social connections.

This event took place in a first-century fishing village on the east side of the Sea of Galilee called Magdala. Most famous to Christians for being the home of Mary Magdalene, it is also the village where the hemorrhaging woman was healed. In 2004 a Roman Catholic priest bought an old resort near what was thought to be the area of the ancient village with the intent to build a Christian retreat center. When excavation for the building began, the builders quickly realized they had hit an archeological site. The retreat center was moved several hundred feet and the Roman road, marketplace, and first-century synagogue were uncovered.

A chapel was built near the marketplace as a replica of the synagogue floorplan with a wall-sized, photo -realistic mural that shows the moment the woman touches the "hem of Jesus' garment" and is made well. It is a powerful experience to stand before this depiction of the long-awaited moment of healing.

Sometimes healing and wellness take a very long time. It did for Abraham and Sarah, for Moses and the Israelites in the wilderness, for the hemorrhaging woman, and sometimes for us. Today I say a prayer of celebration for all who have experienced the relief and joy that comes after a long wait.
