Dear Beloved of Trinity,

We are in a sermon series entitled, "Questions I've Been Meaning to Ask". We have asked you for questions about faith, scripture or topics you've struggled with. With all the questions we've received, we would need another month or two to tackle them all. Thank you so much for your insightful responses. I wish we could preach on all of them but due to time constraints, we needed to pair it down as we only had 3 Sundays.

Last week you heard about tithing. This week you will hear about "Is God real?' and "Why did Jesus die for us?" I chose these two particular questions because they are from children. They handed me their papers personally. I was impressed with the depth and sincerity of their questions, even though the answers are not simple.

Throughout the ages, not only children have asked these questions but scholars, atheists and everyday believers. There are times in our lives when our faith is strong and we can boldly say, "yes, I believe!". And there are times in our lives when we wonder, "Where is God?" There were questions submitted that pertained to that, also.

To answer the question, "is God real?" involves blind faith. We cannot find the answer in text books or the internet (although some might try to convince you otherwise). Interestingly, the Bible makes no argument for the existence of God. Instead, the Bible assumes God's existence from the very beginning...creation of the universe. "In the beginning, God…" Apparently, the biblical writers did not feel a need, to offer arguments for the existence of God. Revelation 1:8 says, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." God has always been. Hebrews 13:8 says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." We trust in his promises of presence from the beginning of time. That is simplified answer to a bold question.

As for why Jesus died for us, there is a story of a garden. God created a perfect world in Genesis. In Genesis 2 we see two distinctly created spaces – the garden of Eden and outside the garden. Choices made, forced humans out of the garden where death is inevitable. God even stationed a mighty cherubim with a flaming sword that flashed back and forth to guard the way back in. To reenter would be death. But death is not the final answer. Our God wants to be in relationship with us…we who are made in his image, we who are adopted into his family, so he provided another way.

The first few verses in the Gospel of John tells us of God, the creator, who joins us outside the garden. We're told that God sets up his residence with and among us, by becoming human and joining us outside of Eden (John 1:14). By choosing to be with us, God is also choosing to experience death. In that sense, Jesus dies because we die.

God became a true human and experienced death. The Apostle Paul says in 2 Corinthians that Jesus was "made to be sin for us" even though he "knew no sin." Jesus takes on the pain and death shared by all humanity. This is where the meaning of the cross takes on importance. This is God laying down his own human life with love for us—on our behalf and for our good. What a wonderful God we worship.

Wow, you people ask great questions! Thank you for participating with us in our sermon series. You are loved and appreciated.
