Dear friends in Christ,

Most of us would agree with Oscar Wilde when he writes, "A fool knows the price of everything and the value of nothing." We also would agree that the most important things in life aren't things at all.

Still, we sometimes forget and fall back into the habit of placing too much value on our personal possessions. Our tendency toward this idolatry is why Jesus regularly contrasts wisdom and foolishness in his teaching and preaching around the topic of money and possessions. Repeatedly, we hear the theme. A wise man builds his house on rock while the foolish man builds on the liquid foundation of sand, a foolish farmer puts his deepest trust in larger granaries instead of trusting the creator who gave life both to the seed and the farmer. Do not store up treasures of possessions on earth because where your treasure is your heart will follow.

Jesus gives his followers a way to approach possessions and wealth that help us own the possessions instead of the possessions owning us. That approach is gratitude, generosity, and trust. We these three core values are seen especially in Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Matthew five and six.

Gratitude. Jesus invites us to view everything that we have as a gift from God. As we regularly say together in the offertory prayer, "ourselves, our time, and our possessions." And in the Lord's Prayer, "Give us this day our daily bread." We are grateful for all that God gives.

Generosity. We are invited to hold on to our possessions lightly and be intentional about giving them away. Christian generosity is an act of worship, a sacrificial discipline, and our duty and delight.

Trust. Whether we have many possessions or few, we trust that God will provide. Do not worry about possessions but strive for the kingdom of God and these things will be given to you as well.

Over the next two weeks as we all take part in our congregation's annual reminder about gratitude and generosity, may we be reminded where our deepest value is found, in Jesus Christ our Lord.
